The Salad Bar, along with the Busy Bean Coffee Shop, provides students with work-based learning opportunities, right here on campus. Both programs are run by the related services team, which includes both occupational therapists and speech language pathologists.**

**Student employees of the Salad Bar and the Busy Bean Coffee Shop are exposed to the following job skills:**

- **Following an arrival routine including hand washing, donning an apron and gloves.**
- **Balancing the cash register before and after a shift.**
- **Inputting orders into a real POS system, handling money, and calculating change.**
- **Customer service - greeting customers, answering phones, delivering orders.**
- **Inventory and restocking supplies when needed.**
- **Cleaning and organizing.**
- **Preparing coffee orders using a Keurig.**
- **Packaging baked goods orders.**
- **Measuring, cutting, and otherwise preparing salad ingredients.**
- **Reading order forms to ensure completeness and accuracy.**

# A REVIEW OF JEFF ROSENSTOCK'S SET AT THE PNC BANK ARTS CENTER

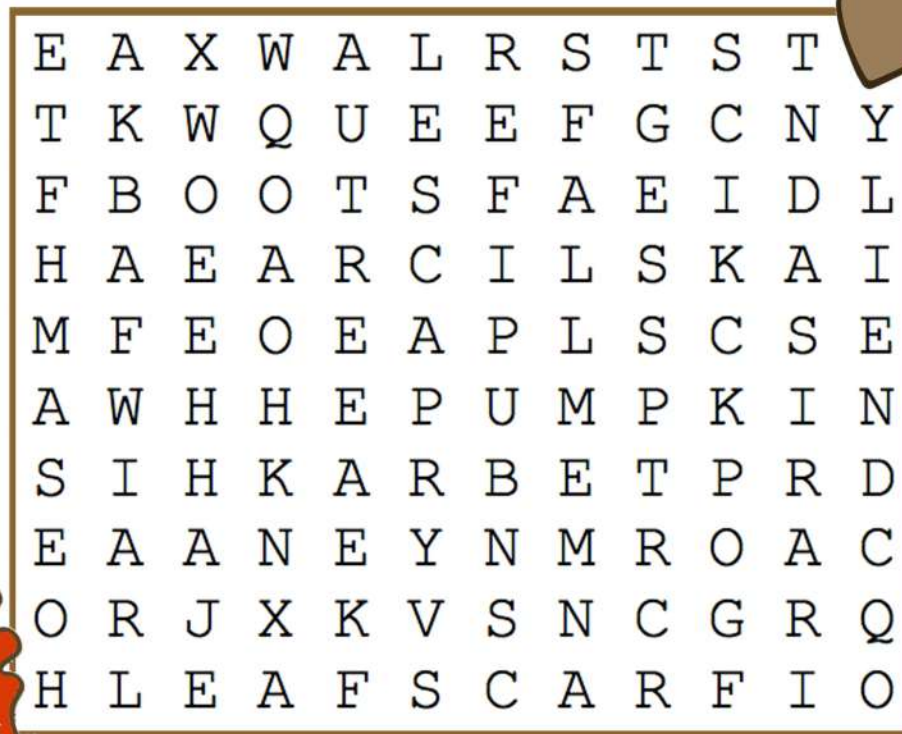
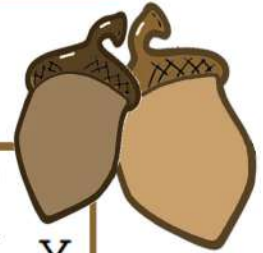
Jeff Rosenstock is my favorite musician of all time. His albums have gotten me through so much in my life (especially "WORRY", which is my favorite album ever). As a dedicated fan through the years, seeing him play a big arena was very rewarding. Sure, The Gaslight Anthem were headlining on their reunion tour, but it was Jeff I was there for. I arrived 5 minutes before his set started. He kicked off his set with ILLEGAL FIREWORKS AND HIDING THEM IN THE SAND (a longer version of the end credits song he does for the Cartoon Network show Craig of the Creek). And then the energy was at a high from there when he went into Scram! off of NO DREAM. He played the singles off of WORRY. (Festival Song and Wave Goodnight to Me), the hits off of We Cool? (Nausea and Hey Allison!) and even the slower songs on POST- (TV Stars and 9/10), making for a very musically diverse set. It was below 50 outside, but that didn't get Jeff or the band's energy down. In fact, it might have kicked up their adrenaline! And even though there were probably some older conservative Gaslight fans in the audience, he didn't shy away from his political songs either-like Festival Song and NO DREAM, the former of which he addressed was about bank-sponsored places like PNC. He closed off his set with You, In Weird Cities from We Cool? which had him go up into the audience to do a saxophone solo while everyone sang along. It was truly majestic to see. The Gaslight Anthem played afterwards, but the show was already made for me. In fact, my friend left later on because he thought that the band was boring (and didn't think they were a good match for Jeff). It was the best show I went to this year just for Jeff alone. I felt like a proud fan watching him and his band play a huge stage spreading his messages around. The moral of this review is: Go to a Jeff Rosenstock show. It could be the most fun and life-affirming thing you can ever have.
